What subject(s) did you study during Sixth Form?

English, Geography, Physics

What are you studying now and where, and what would like to do next?

I'm currently studying English Language and Literature at Oxford University. I'm considering continuing my studies with a Masters degree after, and then pursuing a career in media or writing.

What was your experience of Sixth Form like?

Adapting to sixth form meant choosing not only subjects I felt I was interested in, but ones I felt I could perform best in and manage the workload of. Bearing in mind the required grades and subjects for further education or apprenticeships etc. is also important, but don't feel like this is a must; I hadn't made any decisions about further education when I was starting sixth form.
