

The Rules of Engagement

Online engagement is now the most important aspect of our online/remote learning. We can see that so many of you have overcome any previous barriers and are present, but need to know that you are participating and playing an active part in the lesson. The 'rules off engagement' are:

- 1. Check in and stay in your lesson for the duration.
- 2. Remain muted when working on tasks set by your teacher, but maintain the connection, in order for your teacher to stay in-touch with you and for you easily access your teacher.
- 3. Communicate verbally where possible and via the chat function where your microphone lets you down.

Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD)

On the 27th January, Holocaust Memorial Day took place. Normally, within the Academy we would have marked this through an assembly or indeed tutor based session. Each year, HMD has a different theme, and this year's was "Be the light in the darkness".

For those of you who have not marked this day before. HMD is a time for us to remember the millions of people murdered during the Holocaust, under Nazi Persecution and in the genocides which then followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.

The aim of HMD is to seek to learn the lessons of the past and recognise that genocide does not just take place on its own - it's a steady process which can begin if discrimination, racism and hatred are not checked and prevented.

Through my own experiences is listening to Holocaust Survivors who have visited the Academy in previous years, these have been some of the most impactful accounts that I have listened to during my time as a teacher.

3. Unifrog.org

Our online careers platform is called Unifrog. Many of you were introduced to this during last academic year whether you were in Year 12 or indeed, Year 11.

All of you have been registered with Unifrog and are able to access their variety of careers tools, including an Apprenticeship search tool.

Go to <u>www.unifrog.org</u> and click the 'sign-in' button. From here you will be able to log-in and use the search tool to see which opportunities exist within your locality for apprenticeships that you might be interested in. From the results of the search, you can see how much the apprenticeship would pay, how long it would last, and even has a button to click to apply for anything that you are interested in.

For those of you yet to log-in or have forgotten your username, go to the <u>https://</u> <u>www.unifrog.org/reset-password</u> page and enter your academy email address for a new password to be sent to you immediately, in order to get back on to the website. Again, this is an essential website of which for you to bookmark!
