Sixth Sense

Jurassic World: Kingshurst!

Following the recent release of the next installment in the Jurassic World franchise that my family have always enjoyed watching in addition to a bit of a half term clear-out, I was reminded of my university notes (that I still have on parchment!) reminding me of the how very different the landscape looked millions of years ago in the West Midlands.

Rather than seeing *everything* from a long while ago as being 'Jurassic', this period was precisely 145-199million years ago, a period where Kingshurst, and indeed England would have been joined to a single giant landmass referred to as Pangaea that was located somewhere

near the equator of the planet, prior to this breaking-up and 'moving' upwards into what we now recognize as being the northern hemisphere of our planet, a process referred to as 'continental drift'.

Were we to travel back in time to this period, we would find Kingshurst covered in a warm, shallow, tropical sea (sounds nice!), that gradually receded and gave way to a humid and subtropical climate. On this newly revealed land dinosaurs made their mark in the form of plant eating dinosaurs such as the 16m high Brachiosaurus through to the 27m long Diplodocus on the landscape. Of course the meat eating varieites such as the Allosaurus (a smaller type of T-Rex) also made their mark.

Fun fact for the day: The Tyrannosaurus didn't actually live during the Jurassic period, it lived in late Cretaceous period of 66-68 million years ago! The National History Museum has an excellent website to geek-out on information about each variety of dinosaur information via https://www.nhm.ac.uk/discover/dinosaurs.html.

We are fortunate to have some free and excellent resources in the West Midlands for anyone interested in this area. One such resource is the Lapworth Museum of Geology at the University of Birmingham (https://www.birmingham.ac.uk/facilities/lapworth-museum/index.aspx) which is a fantastic gem of a museum that is free to visit (has free parking at the weekends) and has been long established in the West Midlands for almost 150 years! For anyone interested in Geology, Geography or Earth Sciences this is somewhere that should be on a 'things to do' list.

In addition, for some of our student who travel in from further away in Dudley, the **Wren's Nest National Nature Reserve** is a site seen as being of exceptional importance as one of the most notable geological locations in the British Isles and visited and studied by geologists from all over the world.
