The Mock Exam (Wimbledon) Fortnight

"In West Philadelphia, born and raised..." is a line I'm confident most of us are familiar with thanks to the television institution that was The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air. Despite not being able to compete with that scenario, having grown up in Wimbledon, South London, the Wimbledon fortnight is a point of the year that I used to enjoy. The world and its tourists would descend upon Wimbledon to watch the tennis and there would be masses of energy as players, having practiced all year, would come to demonstrate how good they could be and how well they could achieve.



I draw a similar parallel to this in that with the Year 13s moving-on (with the exception of a few vocational students) our A level and BTEC students now face the chal-

lenge of seeing-out the year, having studied (or practiced) all year and are now presented with their own respective challenge. A Level students have a series of mock examinations in each of their subjects and BTEC students are battling to complete all of this year's coursework in order to be invited back next year. Whatever your challenge, you MUST work hard to perform at your best. Sometimes turning-up isn't enough and an extra 'push' is required!

In 2010, this 'push' happened in the form of two tennis players, John Isner and Nicolas Mahut, who went head-to-head at Wimbledon and became the longest tennis match in history, stretching over three days in order for one of them to win by 70 games to 68 (normally 6 games are required to win a 'set'). Neither of these players knew they were going to have to work this hard, but had put in the training to be able to call upon this ability when required to do so. How many of you academically could say the same?

As ever, there are no short cuts. Ensure that you put in the time to revise. Utilise the Sixth Form laptops to conduct online revision or to complete coursework and make use of the resources based in both the Common Room and indeed, the Information Centre. In addition, ensure that you get the right amount of sleep, some exercise and continue to eat well in your normal fashion.
