

New to this year... Critical Reading

We know that reading is an integral building block to all learning and has direct links to academic attainment. As a reading rich school, we know that it is important to provide our students with opportunities to undertake wider reading beyond the curriculum and develop critical thinking skills. Therefore, this year, all Sixth Form students will be part of a critical reading group, which will allow students and staff to meet daily for 20 minutes to experience texts together through collaboration and discussion.

Key details:

- There is no expectation for students to read aloud, but active participation is encouraged.
- All students are expected to attend daily critical reading sessions.
- Sessions will be low stakes for students to relax and enjoy, with no written work or formal assessments involved.
- Universities and employees are looking for candidates that stand out. Being able to voice views and opinions on what we have read will make us unique. Universities and employers may ask about interests outside of work. Students can write about their role in the critical reading group in their UCAS personal statement/ CV.
- Each term, everyone in the year group will be reading the same text. This means that students can have conversations about their reading with peers and staff.
